ESTABLISH NO PARKING ON THE WEST SIDE OF WALNUT STREET  
FROM 8TH STREET SOUTH FOR A TOTAL DISTANCE OF 102 FEET

WHEREAS, the vehicle parking currently allowed on this street can limit access for delivery to the business adjacent to the proposed parking restriction; and

WHEREAS, there is sufficient parking with both on-street and off-street parking available for the neighboring properties; and

WHEREAS, The Board of City Commissioners of the City of Yankton has the authority to establish and revoke parking restrictions within the City of Yankton.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Yankton, SD, that parking is prohibited on the west side of Walnut Street from the 8th Street end-of-radius, south for a total distance of 102 feet.

ESTABLISH A 180 FOOT NO PARKING ZONE  
ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF 19<sup>TH</sup> STREET  
250 FEET EAST OF 19<sup>TH</sup> STREET & SUMMIT STREET INTERSECTION

WHEREAS, vehicles parking on 19<sup>th</sup> Street can hinder the maneuverability of semi-trucks making deliveries; and

WHEREAS, removing parking in the above-described area would provide additional space for delivery drivers to easily access delivery locations, and

WHEREAS, establishing no parking on 19<sup>th</sup> Street would create a safer situation by increasing the line of sight for vehicles leaving the Northern Extrusion parking lot; and

WHEREAS, The Board of City Commissioners of the City of Yankton has the authority to establish and revoke parking restrictions within the City of Yankton.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Yankton, SD, that parking is prohibited on the south side of 19<sup>th</sup> Street, starting at a point approximately 250 feet from the 19<sup>th</sup> Street & Summit Street intersection and extending to the east for 180 feet.

WHEREAS, Kim McLaury has signed an agreement assuming the responsibilities and obligations of the current lease agreement; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Yankton and the operations of Chan Gurney Municipal Airport to approve the transfer of the ownership of this airport hangar and to approve the assignment of the land lease agreement to Kim McLaury,

**RESOLUTION #26-04**

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATION THE SPEED LIMIT ON  
DOUGLAS AVENUE FROM 31<sup>ST</sup> STREET TO WILSON ROAD AND  
WILSON ROAD FROM BROADWAY AVENUE TO DOUGLAS AVENUE

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners is authorized, by SDCL 9-31-3, to establish the speed at which motor vehicles may travel upon any street in the City; and

WHEREAS, Douglas Avenue from 31<sup>st</sup> Street to Wilson Road, and Wilson Road from Broadway Avenue to Douglas Avenue are three-lane roads that are able to accommodate higher speeds; and

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners has determined that this is an appropriate speed for the traffic on these streets.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the speed limit at the following locations be designated at 30 miles per hour:

- Douglas Avenue from 31<sup>st</sup> Street to Wilson Road
- Wilson Road from Broadway Avenue to Douglas Avenue

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager is authorized and directed to install and maintain 30 mile-per-hour speed limit signs on these streets.

Public Works Director Adam Haberman gave an update on the City's Active Transportation Program and an internal analysis on intersections at 19<sup>th</sup>/Douglas Avenue and 21<sup>st</sup> Street/Mulberry Street utilizing the MUTCD standards. A KLJ traffic study quote was presented as well for \$45,595. General Commission discussion ensued. The traffic study was determined as not being required at that time. The Commission requested public input and to revisit in the future. No official Commission action was taken at this time.
