Welcome to the Yankton Community Library! This user's guide will introduce you to the collections and services offered by the Library.

About the Library

Established in 1903, Yankton Community Library is one of the oldest libraries in South Dakota. Our library strives to maintain a diverse, dynamic collection along with timely services and programs. The Yankton Community Library is a City library funded through local taxes, and governed by a mayoral-appointed board. The Library also serves Yankton County residents under an agreement, serving a total population of over 25,000. The staff prides itself on providing quality library service to all patrons.

Getting a Card

Library Cards are free to all residents who live or own property within the city limits of Yankton. Yankton County residents pay \$20 yearly per household. The cost of a nonresident card is \$40 yearly per household. Nonresident cards can be purchased in increments of three, six, or twelve months. Cards for teachers and Mount Marty College students are free.

A picture ID and proof of current address are required for a library card. Children may get their own card with a parent/guardian signature. Cards are renewed annually.

Programs and Events

If you need additional accommodation to participate in any library event, please contact the library.

- **Children's programming:** story time, stay & play, after school activities, and reading programs.
- **Teen / Tween programming:** after school activities, events, after-hour events, and reading programs.
- **Adult programming:** craft nights, seed library classes, book clubs, and reading programs.
- **Special Events:** author visits, performers, and speakers.

Materials, Loan Periods, and Fines

The library has over 84,000 items for people of all ages. Our collection includes fiction and nonfiction for adults, teens, and children, reference materials, electronic databases, magazines, newspapers, DVDs, audiobooks, eBooks, and eAudiobooks. Patrons can check out more than just books, such as LEGO kits, NASA packs, museum, pool, & state park passes, recreational equipment, light therapy lamps, and more!

Access your account online at library.cityofyankton.org. There you can renew items, reserve materials, review your account, and view our calendar of events.

Use the number on the back of your library card and your last name (all lowercase) as your PIN.

There are no late fees on books, magazines, audiobooks, and music CDs. All other items accrue fines. Patrons are financially responsible for all items checked out under their card. Replacement items must receive staff approval before being accepted.

Checkout Limits: Books: 50 • Audiobooks: 10 • Magazines: 10 • CD Music: 10 • Read-Alongs: 5 • DVDS: 8 (2 may be TV Series)

Loan Periods: Books & Audiobooks: 3 weeks; Magazines, CDs, DVDs, High-Demand Books: 1 week
