I. ROUTINE BUSINESS

Roll Call:

Present: Cody Kneifl, Sam Hummel, Bruce Barnes, Zach Hoover, Tom Bixler, and City Commissioner Brian Hunhoff.

Minutes: September 15, 2025 minutes approved. Hoover motioned. Kneifl second. Motion passed 5-0.

II. OLD BUSINESS

A. The Westside Park Pickleball court conversion: The contractor completed the pickleball courts on Tuesday, September 23, and the project is now substantially complete. Connector sidewalks were installed between the courts and the open-air shelter, as well as from the shelter to the new walk-in gate on the south fence line. Drainage improvements were added along the south side of the facility, with rock placed in areas designed for water collection and flow.

The facility sidewalk leading to the SE walk-in gate meet ADA requirements and the courts are ADA accessible.

If people want to reserve the courts for large-group play, they would contact the Parks Department office and work with Chasity.

Additional future improvements include installation of a sidewalk from the pickleball courts to the drinking fountain and to the west parking lot.

All paperwork has been finalized and submitted for the \$34,000 LWCF grant reimbursement.

B. Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant: A formal presentation for the TAP Grant will be made to the State Department of Transportation on Tuesday, November 18. The request is for the replacement of the pedestrian bridge on the Auld-Brokaw Trail between Douglas and Walnut Streets. The City of Yankton is proposing to replace the existing structure with an 8-foot-wide trail sections will be constructed to connect the bridge to the existing trail on both the east and west sides.

The total estimated project cost is \$545,952.63.

The City's share of the cost is 18.05%, totaling \$98,544.45.

The TAP Grant request covers the remaining \$447,408.18.



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III. NEW BUSINESS

- A. America's 250th Celebration – Dakota Territorial Capitol Replica Refurbishment: The City of Yankton has established a taskforce to plan events in recognition of "Yankton, SD Celebrates America's 250th." In addition to organizing community activities, the taskforce aims to raise funds to refurbish the Dakota Territorial Capitol Replica Building located in Riverside Park. The replica was designed and constructed by the Yankton Sertoma Club beginning in 1988 and completed in April 1989. On April 14, 1989, Governor George Mickelson designated Yankton as "Capital for a Day" and formally dedicated the building.

The taskforce has set an ambitious fundraising goal of \$100,000 to support the refurbishment effort. Planned improvements include:

- New siding
- New paint
- New windows
- New exterior doors
- Chimney repairs
- Repairs to restore the bell to working condition
- New wood shakes

It was brought forward to speak with the High School Trades class instructor to see what work they may be interested in when it comes to the refurbishing of the outside of the building.

It was also brought forward that the taskforce should identify an inside space that could be used as a back-up location for the 4th of July concert in case of inclement weather.

- B. Riverside Baseball Stadium Improvements: MMU has requested a meeting in the near future to discuss concepts for constructing a clubhouse/locker room facility at Riverside Baseball Stadium. The discussion will also include the potential installation of a video board at the field.
- C. Holiday Festival of Lights and Parade: The Holiday Festival of Lights and Parade will take place on Thursday, December 4, 2025. Luke Youmans has been coordinating with downtown businesses and local organizations to provide family-friendly activities from 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., leading up to the parade at 6:00 p.m.

The Christmas Tree lighting will occur at 7:00 p.m. at its new location east of the Dakota Territorial Capitol Building in Riverside Park, followed by a fireworks display from the top level of the Meridian Bridge.

Christmas lighting is being installed throughout Riverside Park, and the Yankton Morning Optimists Club will host Santa's Workshop at the Capitol Building on select weekends in December.

As a part of the Design South Dakota meetings with community stakeholders, it was made clear that the designs needed to include an enhanced downtown landscape including trees. When architectural students from South Dakota State University were invited to visit the downtown and provide input, they complimented the downtown area on the historic buildings and beautiful architecture. They were also quick to discuss the large overgrown trees that were found in the downtown areas and how the trees were taking away from the beautiful architecture. So, it was planned that a few of the large overgrown trees in the Meridian District be taken down each year to help address this issue. As the large trees are removed, it is important to replant trees to continue to provide shade and nature in the streetscape. The City will coordinate planting some trees, which are appropriate for a downtown streetscape both in size and species, to take the place of the trees that have been removed. Not only is it important to have the right type of tree, but the City also realizes it is important to have the right location, i.e. not in front of a door or not blocking signage. As a part of the plan, locations have been identified to plant trees in the downtown area and have been mapped using GPS. Each year, urban forestry identifies a couple of the locations that will get a new tree. A letter gets sent to the adjacent property owner of the identified locations to notify them of the plan and to answer any questions or concerns they may have. Realizing, some property owners may choose to not have a tree planted, and then a different location is chosen. Through time, the downtown will be repopulated with the appropriate trees.

- Total Cash Revenue at the SAC 2/1-15/26 – \$19,369.30 compared to \$15,716.55 in 2025.
- Great Life Reimbursement Payment:
 - January 2026: \$4,921.50 (\$4,773.00 – January 2025)
- Most of the lighting in the aquatics area at the SAC has been converted to LED lights and therefore there are less fixtures in the area since the LED lights put out more light than the fluorescent lights that were in the area.
- The SAC is planning the annual spring pool dump and maintenance week in the aquatics area for the 3rd week in March.

Parks

- Luke is working on finalizing the food-truck line-up for the July 4 concert and fireworks. The fireworks display will be from the upper deck of the Meridian Bridge.
- A task force has been formed and will be planning events for “Yankton, SD Celebrates America’s 250th” in 2026.

- The Sertoma Park ice skating rink is no longer being maintained for ice.
- With the unseasonably warm temperatures, portable toilets were ordered and placed at Riverside Park and Westside Park for those utilizing the play areas. The restroom on the SW corner of the aquatic center has been opened. The restrooms on the southside of the water treatment plant in Riverside Park have also been opened.
- The Parks Staff purchased and installed some handrails on the floating docks at the boat ramp in Riverside Park. The department had a couple of requests for handrails to help with securing boats to the docks and for the safety of those getting in and out of the boats when utilizing the docks.
- The Parks Department will be working with the Street Department to take down dead, diseased, or hazardous trees on City property and in street ROW's. Parks staff are trimming trees in parks and green spaces maintained by the City. The Street Department helps in this effort with large limbs. Ash trees are being removed also as a part of the Emerald Ash Borer Mitigation Plan for ROW's, boulevards, and City owned property.
- The parks staff have been removing snow and ice from city properties, sidewalks, parking lots, and some other public rights-of-way when winter weather happens.
- The parks staff will be ready to put up Veteran's banners and banner holders when the materials are received from the Rotary Club in the months to come. March 1 is their deadline for purchasing a banner.
- The parks staff will be cutting volunteer trees from the bank of the Missouri River in Riverside Park. The staff first burned the bank to help remove unwanted grasses and shrubs that would have been harder to work through when removing volunteer trees.
- The spaces and places staff will be trimming trees in the parks and along the trails.
- There is one open position with the Parks Department for a ground's maintenance worker. We will advertise for the open position in the month of March in the hopes of getting more applicants. The other ground maintenance position that was open has been filled internally with an employee from the transfer station.
